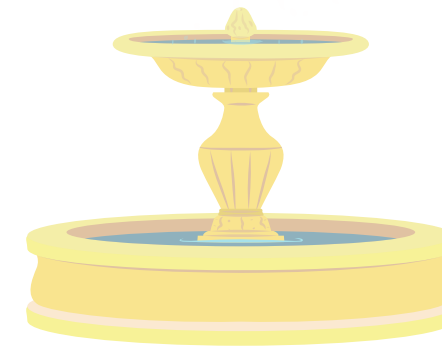
RÁQUIRA

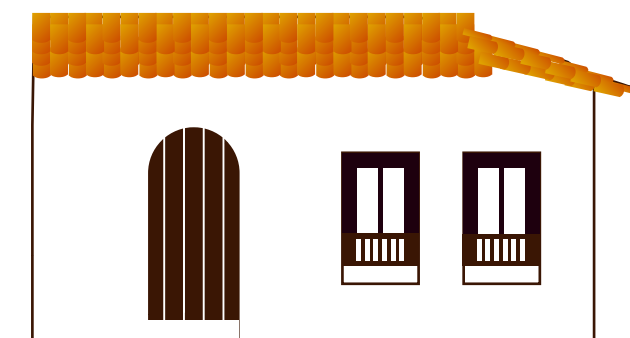
VILLA DE LEYVA
